The Parrett Mountain Farm was established to provide an educational and historical opportunity to the general public by recreating and preserving a turn of the century Oregon farm as well as protect approximately 400 acres from encroaching urban development. The mission is to preserve this acreage to give people an appreciation of what drew early settlers to the area.

In the woods of the Parrett Mountain Farm, you will find the dappled sunlight shining through ancient trees and are able to surround yourself with the peace and tranquility of this special place. We are excited about the opportunity to expose Yamhill County residents and the general public at large to our beautiful site.

"Impressions of Nature" gives local artists the opportunity to create art using a media mix of 70% from the land and the farm and 30% of their choosing. Artists had the entire summer of 2009 to create unique pieces to go on display September 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of 2009. These pieces will be displayed utilizing the natural landscape of Parrett Mountain Farm as the backdrop.
